

Ahmad Al Rashdan, Ph.D., is currently a senior research and development scientist at Idaho National Laboratory (INL). Dr. Al Rashdan holds a Ph.D. in nuclear engineering from Texas A&M University, a M.Sc. in information technology and automation systems from Esslingen University of Applied Science in Germany, and a B.Sc. in mechanical engineering from Jordan University of Science and Technology. He has more than 15 years of industrial and research experience in automation, instrumentation, and control, including experience at INL, ABB, Texas A&M University, the IAEA, Daimler Chrysler-Mercedes Group, and Fraunhofer Institute for Production and Automation. His experience includes automated work processes using AI methods and advanced analytics, online condition monitoring of nuclear systems, control-systems design and development, and automated modeling and simulation. Dr. Al Rashdan is an active contributor to and co-organizer of several professional events and scientific conferences. He authored or co-authored more than 60 technical reports and journal papers and seven patent applications and is an active reviewer for several nuclear energy and IEEE journals, as well as many DOE grants. Dr. Al Rashdan is a senior member of the IEEE and a member of the American Nuclear Society. He serves on the ANSI's United States National Committee Technical Advisory Group and as part of the working group responsible for developing the IEC standard on Artificial Intelligence in the nuclear industry.
